

Other relevant issues brought to the State's attention at the review:

- More than 600 people have died to the use of Tasers, especially young people, even people as young as 8-16 years old, why would that history, do you find yourself in such a situation in Chicago where there is a systematic use of Tasers. No guidelines, or structure, or trials. Or maybe there is. Can you give information on this problem? Inequality in courts, POC not guarantee the rights that non-POC experience.
- The drone operations have direct impact on people in Yemen, especially children and women, suffer PTSD. Impact of civilian population, is state department aware of this trauma. Can define this as ill treatment
- Conversion by clergy for LBGT, also mentioned as a problem, especially for youths
- Commentary on detainment on children, LGBT, women, etc.

• Concluding observations:

- The delegation sees common ground with the Committee against Torture
- Torture is not practiced anymore and American courts, Congress, and the American people have condemned the practice
- The results of the past will be that we will strengthen legislation against torture
